

Miranda Feuchtwang, London UK

Miranda is now almost fully retired from clinical practice, but her background was as a child and adolescent psychotherapist, trained at the Tavistock Clinic, later training as an adult therapist at the British Association of Psychotherapists, She worked in the British NHS as a child psychotherapist for many years, and later in private practice as an adult therapist. Together with Lydia Tischler, Miranda was one of the founding midwives of the EFPP and of its child section in 1991 and remained closely involved as a child section delegate. She was elected onto the board of efpp, as an adult section delegate, serving as hon secretary, and later as vice chair and adult section co-ordinator until she stepped down in 2013. During the early nineties, Miranda joined Lydia in teaching on the Czech child psychotherapy training in Prague, and she has taught on child and adult trainings in the UK. Miranda is not a group analyst, but has extensive Tavistock Group Relations experience, working with staff at conferences in UK, Ireland, Israel and Bulgaria.




Ruth Duek, Tel Aviv Israel

Ruth Duek, Senior Clinical Psychologist, Group Analyst, active in IIGA and Besod Siach (organization for promotion of dialogue between conflict groups in Israeli society.) I served as Chairperson for Besod Siach and was on staff and also director of many of our conferences. I have served as head psychologist for the Israeli Prison System and have worked extensively with incestuous families: perpetrators, bystanders

and survivors. I am trying to retire from years of private practice (but as we all know, it's not really possible to retire completely.) I conducted an analytic group in my private practice for 20 years. In my private life, I was widowed in the Yom Kippur War and have raised my daughter (who was aged 4 at the time) alone. Today she lives with me as a single mother and together we are raising two grandsons. Their father is a homosexual living with his partner and both of them are also active in raising the boys. 5 years ago our house was completely destroyed in a wildfire. We have since rebuilt and returned home. But in many ways I can appreciate what people experience in times of war and catastrophe and therefore feel very involved and able to learn from my participation in this group. I am looking forward to conducting together with Miranda and John.

John C. Rhead, Maryland US

I am a psychologist by inclination—the human psyche has fascinated me since I was a child—and by training. While obtaining psychology degrees from prestigious institutions I frequently felt less intelligent and sophisticated than my peers. Some of these feelings of fascination and inferiority have been aroused in me while attending EFPP meetings regarding Ukraine. I believe that psychotherapists are the front lines of psychological research into the human unconscious—personal, collective, and transpersonal. What we learn in our lifelong

exploration of the depths of our own psyches allows us to help our clients explore theirs and can help heal the world. In fact it may be the only thing that can help heal the world. I am now in full time private practice after having engaged in research on psychedelic-assisted psychotherapy 50 years ago, followed by a faculty appointment in psychiatry at a medical school, a consulting position in a prison, work with adolescents and their families in a special school for emotionally disturbed youth, being a program director at a private psychiatric hospital, and other professional activities.
